# **Shadows, Olympiads and Anniversary Gear**

The shortest month of the year includes several celebrations that seem to help take the chill out of winter. Ground Hog Day (Feb 2<sup>nd</sup>), Valentine's Day (Feb 14<sup>th</sup>) and Presidents Day (Feb 20<sup>th</sup>) at least temporarily change the focus from cold weather to hope for an early spring, romance and a long weekend. While some Northern Virginia Volksmarchers await warmer weather before resuming their favorite walks, other club members are headed south this month in search of fun, fitness and fellowship.

The IVV Olympiad and International Marching League Texas Trail Roundup in San Antonio offer eight days of walking, biking and swimming events from Feb 19-26<sup>th</sup>. NVV Club members Ron Jones, Heather Warden, Dianne Purdy and I plan to join participants from at least 25 countries and 40 states during the first Olympiad in North America. As the IVV pass stamps pictured below highlight, Susan and I have been fortunate to attend similar international festivals in Italy (Sud Tyrol in 2013), Germany (Koblenz in 2017) and France (Aix En Provence in 2019).



Volkssport events from the Olympiad Village, located on the famous riverwalk, will include scenic routes from 5km to 42km. A parade, opening and closing ceremonies, live entertainment, a rodeo, and an AVA membership meeting are also on the schedule. 
